Supplies (PAWS) Report

The 53rd annual Report on Protection and Augmentation of Water Supplies (PAWS), 2024 was filed with the Clerk of the Board on February 23, 2024 as required by the District Act. It contains the recommended groundwater production and other water charges for fiscal year 2024-25. A copy for your review in preparation for the public hearing, which opens on April 9, 2024, can be downloaded at the following URL:

http://www.valleywater.org/GroundwaterChargeProcess

Also posted at the above URL, or linked from that page, are the notices to well owners and surface water users, which describe the rate-setting process, give the rationale for the determination of proposed rates, and provide the dates and times of upcoming public hearings. These notices were mailed to all well owners and surface water users of record on February 23. Note that there are four notices, a groundwater and a surface water notice for North County Zone W-2 and a groundwater and a surface water notice for South County (Zones W-5, W-7 and W-8). A total of 376 North County and 3,172 South County customers receive these notices. The information will also be shared with subscribers to the district's 55,000+ eNewsletter in March.

Hardcopies of the PAWS report and the well owner notices will be distributed to the Board at the February 27, 2024 meeting; additional copies are available upon request. If you have any questions, please call me at 408-630-2135 or Darin Taylor at 408-630-3068.

Dear Chair Hsueh, Vice Chair Santos, and Members of the Board:

I am writing to you in my capacity as the President of the San Jose/Silicon Valley Branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). Our relentless pursuit for justice and equality stands resolute as we tackle incidents of racism, discrimination, and prejudice in all spheres of our community.

We are distressed and concerned by the recent findings from the Meyers Nave law firm regarding the conduct of Santa Clara Valley Water District Board Member Rebecca Eisenberg. The investigators' reports, which were made public on Friday, February 23, 2024, substantiate severe allegations and paint a troubling picture of the organizational environment.

Valley Water has long been distinguished as an exemplary institution serving the people of Santa Clara County. The allegations levied against Director Rebecca Eisenberg and substantiated by an independent investigation thus run counter to the very levels of respect, dignity, and ethical conduct that one expects from such a prestigious entity.

The documented instances of discriminatory harassment based on sex, age, and country of origin, as well as other harassing and offensive conduct, are incompatible with the values of the NAACP, the community you serve, and should be so with the ethos of the Board of Directors.

Addressing these substantiated incidents requires more than mere acknowledgement; it necessitates decisive action. The community looks to you to uphold the values you profess and the policies you have put in place to safeguard your staff and stakeholders against harassment, bullying, and racism.

Such actions go against the fabric of equality and justice for all, values that Valley Water and the NAACP stand firmly for. In light of the distress these findings have spurred among the victims and the larger community, it is the NAACP's position that swift and decisive action is warranted.

Our position remains uncompromising; no form of hostile workplace behavior is minor. It is incumbent upon Valley Water to take appropriate measures that not only address the current allegations but also prevent such behavior from recurring.

Please consider the gravity of this situation and the message it sends to our community. The NAACP will closely monitor the developments and anticipates swift remedial action from the board.

Our call to you today is a call for accountability, integrity, and transparency. It is a call to reaffirm your commitment to a working environment free from discrimination in any form. In light of this, the San Jose/Silicon Valley NAACP urges:

- 1. The immediate censure of Director Rebecca Eisenberg.
- 2. A thorough reexamination of current policies to reinforce zero tolerance towards discrimination.
- 3. Providing a public report on the outcomes of the investigations and actions taken, thus reinforcing accountability to the community you serve

It falls upon your shoulders to set the precedent that discrimination will not be tolerated, and to restore confidence in those looking to your organization for leadership and support. We trust that these issues will be addressed with the urgency and seriousness they undeniably warrant.

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
Hi Valley Water board members + Jennifer,

It was great to hear from the last meeting that the members of the encampment committee recognize how frustrating it's been that there's been no change in the camping situation on many of the creeks including Los Gatos creek for over a year even though initial plans were started for a relocation set up for it.

In the last encampment meeting (set around August), Jim Bealle mentioned that he wanted to set up a timeline and action items for how to use the newly allocated funds for assisting the homeless that opened up in January. In the last meeting, he again expressed his desire for action items and to see results. Rebecca Eisenberg also expressed her desire to see action being taken and suggested working with a tiny home non-profit and providing funding for tiny homes to be built for relocation. I wanted to check in with the council and ask if action plans were written up and a timeline established six months ago. I also wanted to check in with you guys and see if action items were planned from the last meeting and a time line established for the development of tiny homes.

I am also writing this as I'm waiting on the police to arrive so I can file a police report. A homeless man just tried to hit me with his bike, screamed profanities at me and called me a fucking Korean (I am not ethinically Korean and am a US citizen). I just wanted to walk my dog quietly on the creek before the sun went down and it was still safe to do so. I was not expecting to be harassed and racially profiled and am sick and tired of these experiences becoming a common occurrence.

Like Ms. Eisenberg emphasized, people are dying outside from exposure and the rain, the creek is being severely eroded (which will then contribute to future risk of flooding) and the residents around the creeks are suffering. Please treat this like the urgent matter that it is.

Thank you for your response. I saw there is a zoom meeting this Thursday. I will possibly be attending but I wanted to bring this to your attention first.

I am resident at the River Walk Apartments located at 1510 S. Bascom Ave. directly next to the Los Gatos Creek Trail. You may be aware of the homeless encampment on the embankment near the corner of S. Bascom Ave and Southwest Expy. This embankment is property of the San Jose Valley Water District. I have attached videos to this email showing how much of a problem this area has become. There is a sign posted that says "No Trespassing". However, it seems this encampment is being allowed to form. Last week, I spoke to a group of officers that I saw walking this area. They informed me they were looking for anyone with warrants, but didn't have authorization to trespass anyone. Now that I see there is a no trespassing sign that makes no sense to me.

I am reaching out as a concerned resident looking for how to remove this encampment from the area. I could easily start a petition if you find that would be helpful to this cause. I am sympathetic towards the homeless population but also understand that Santa Clara County offers a ton of programs and assistance to those in need. I do see cleanup crews every couple of months to clean this area. However, I believe it's time for significant changes. One of the videos shows the fence has been opened to make an entrance. That fence appears to be property of the apartment complex next to it. There should be a joint effort made to secure this entrance point with new heavy-duty fencing.

Thanks for reaching out regarding the encampments along Los Gatos Creek between Bascom Ave. and Leigh Ave. Valley Water has scheduled an enhanced cleanup next week on February 26-29 to address the creekside trash, debris, and hazardous pollutants in this reach. During the cleanup, our crew will also remove any discarded needles that they encounter.

As to whether the portable toilet facilities deployed in this reach have attracted additional encampments, our numbers don't bear this out. Since the facilities were installed, there has been some in- and out-migration of encampments in the reach. But the data collected by Valley Water staff indicate that the overall count has not changed. We'll continue to monitor the encampment trends.

Additionally, please note that the City of San José manages the trails along the creek. Regarding unauthorized vehicular access, our staff have observed that the City's security bollards are missing at the trail entrances at both Bascom and Leigh. We've contacted the City Parks Department to alert them to the missing bollards—hopefully they can be replaced soon to prevent vehicles from entering. The City also maintains the wooden split-rail fencing along the trail, which you noted as damaged and being used for firewood. As always, please continue to contact the fire department if you observe smoke or fire. Concerns relating to fires and unwanted or illegal behaviors are best handled by City resources.

Under Valley Water's Memorandum of Agreement with the City of San José, we work with the City to ensure they provide outreach services to unsheltered individuals residing on Valley Water lands within city limits. However, we're unaware of the Homeless Concerns survey you cited, in which a significant number of unsheltered individuals may have expressed a lack of interest in housing. It is Valley Water's understanding that City outreach staff extend as many offers of housing or shelter as they are able to, but that the overall shortage of housing availability is the primary factor preventing more people from moving indoors.

Hi Barbara,

My name is Sam and I am the president of the Hamilton Place Neighborhood Association and a homeowner between Bascom and Leigh ave. We are a collective of 52 households that are very concerned with the growing encampment on Valley Water Public land.

I am writing to bring your attention to the growing encampment on the Los Gatos Creek trail between Bascom and Leigh Ave.. The situation is becoming increasingly urgent, and I believe that the port-a-potty service maintained on the trail is attracting more and more unhoused individuals to the area.

In a survey conducted by City of San Jose (Homeless Concern) in October of 2023, 90% of the individuals were not interested in housing. This is a +30% increase in individuals who have no interest in housing offers from April 6th 2023.

Here is what we are facing in our neighborhood:

- 1. Discarded needles along the trail
- 2. Additional structures in parallel with the deployment of a Port-a-potty
- 3. Increase blight by the creek side
- 4. Damage to fencing (used in firewood)
- 5. Frequent calls to SJFD because of smoke and fire
- 6. Vehicular access to trail and encampment on both Leigh and Bascom Ave.

What is the plan for individuals who are refusing housing? I was in attendance in the latest ECCC and while there is an outsized representation of what the needs of unhoused individuals are, I find the lack of representation of your constituents' interests discouraging.

Can we meet for a discussion on what can realistically be achieved here? We would love to have you champion our interests since you are our district representative.

To the Board of Valley Water,

I have lived 28 years on Fell Court. My husband and I raised 4 children and have loved this location. We often road bikes or walked to Almaden Lake and loved that we could do it on the path adjacent to the percolation ponds and stream totally avoiding any streets with cars. The last 7 years I was doing it with my grandkids, but not since the homeless community has multiplied. It is just not safe.

Today under the freeways on this island where about 25 tents are set up there was a large fire. It could be seen for miles. The firetrucks and police were out there as the fireman where trying to put it out. Last week there was another fire that was on the land to the right the percolation ponds where there is a huge encampment. The smell was so toxic!! It smelled like they were burning tires. The neighbors all started texting each other. There are fires large and small that we all have to deal with on a regular basis. My niece lives at the back of Dawnview Ct. and is always affected by these fires. So sad because her husband and her bought this over a million dollar home right before the homeless took over the land behind their house.

I'm sure you will know this name, Brigitte Rince, who constantly contacted you as she daily dealt with homeless community incidents since she lived on the end of Chynoweth on the right side of the street. She was traumatized by having to deal with a women screaming being raped, gun shots during the night, intruders from the homeless community in her yard yelling at her, numerous fires, and much more. Her husband Mark and her were long time residents and well liked and respected in our neighborhood. Well, they couldn't take it any more and moved out and now their house is up for sale. It's going on 3 weeks, but no sale. Beautifully remodeled kitchen and bathroom, pool, and large lot, but who would want to buy that house when they see all the tents right by her yard and on the other side of the lake. Another family had to disclose the homeless encampment when they put there house for sale and it really affects property values.

In the last 5 year+ all my neighbors have bought security cameras or burglar alarms due to cars being broken into. Quite often we are calling each other to ask if they can look at the view from their camera's angle due to some type of intrusion or attempted break in. This is since the encampment.

We have had one man with a sword try to steal toys from a little boy on our block. We had to call the police because he disappeared and we knew he didn't leave the court. He ended hiding behind a garbage can and scared my female neighbor when he jumped out at her with his sword. He is well know as he had bothered others on other streets. He definitely has mental illness, like a lot of the homeless unfortunately suffer from.

I know that you are planning to put tiny homes by the bass shopping center, and I was glad to hear this, but it will definitely not be able to house all these people in tents. Plus, I understand some prefer living in the tents. Some may move, but what is going to keep more people moving into the spaces that become vacant? What is the plan to relocate these people and prevent them or new people moving on to this land?

I have been a 40 year resident in my home and I have also noticed a substantial increase in my Homeowner's Insurance Premiums.


I wanted to make sure you saw these pictures and have read what I have submitted to you. I know in times past, there were similar fires that some/all of you were not aware had occurred.



I hope this letter finds you well. I am a resident of San Jose living near the 85 overpass by the Oak Ridge Mall for the past 10 years. I am writing to urgently bring to your attention a growing concern in our neighborhood regarding the presence of homeless encroachers around the Almaden Percolation Ponds. As a concerned resident and member of this community, I am deeply troubled by recent events that have disturbed the peace and safety of our area.

Hello Mrs. Root,

Thank you for your email and interest in the Upper Penitencia Creek Flood Protection project.

In prior discussions with the City of San Jose (City), Santa Clara Valley Water District (Valley Water) staff have not been informed of the City's King Road Beautification Project. Nevertheless, Valley Water does not have any concerns if the City chooses to move forward with their King Road Bridge Widening Project. Based on our discussions with City of San Jose staff, it is our understanding that the bridge project is not yet funded by the City. The City's bridge design would need to include continued operation of Valley Water's stream gauge at that location and not change the creek's flow capacity. During our recent discussions, City expressed interest in exploring the cost share opportunities for their Bridge Project with Valley Water. More information about the City's King Road Bridge Widening Project can be obtained by reaching out to Zahi Khattab, principal engineer with City of San Jose at (408) 975-3252 or Zahi.Khattab@sanjoseca.gov.

Valley Water recently began design of the Upper Penitencia Creek Flood Protection project which will provide flood protection improvements between Coyote Creek confluence up to Capitol Avenue, which includes King Road. Our current schedule is to complete design by summer 2027. After additional funding is obtained, Valley Water can move forward with construction of the flood protection improvements.

Valley Water will be coordinating with the City on the Upper Penitencia Creek Flood Protection project design and will also inquire about their King Road bridge widening project. Dear Chris Kouretas,

Thank you for reaching out to Valley Water and sharing your frustrations related to the encampments of unsheltered people located along Willow Street at Lelong Street. Valley Water must work in concert with cities and the County to address encampments such as the ones on Willow Street. The City of San José's portable toilets and dumpster at this site are offered as part of its Services, Outreach, Assistance and Resources (SOAR) program. While Valley Water cannot control illegal dumping invited by the presence of the City's dumpster, our crews do remove the accumulated trash during our scheduled cleanups. Our cleanup crew visited this reach of the Guadalupe River on February 5th and 6th and removed 14.02 tons of encampment-generated trash and debris. Valley Water has also added vehicle deterrents at this location to restrict unauthorized motor vehicle access.

Although encampment relocations are curtailed at this time, our crews continue to perform large scale trash cleanups throughout jurisdictional areas countywide to prevent encampment-generated trash and debris from polluting the waterways. Recently, Valley Water's Board of Directors approved new staffing resources to support greater service and coordination toward cleaning up trash, debris, and hazardous pollutants produced by encampments along waterways in Santa Clara County. This increased level of service means that Valley Water cleanup crews will be able to visit impacted areas more often.

As with all public agencies, Valley Water must adhere to applicable case law, which has significantly affected how we can respond to encampments of unsheltered people. A 2019 court ruling by the 9th Circuit Federal Court of Appeals in the case of Martin v. Boise has limited the ability of California public agencies to relocate unsheltered individuals who are camping on public lands. This ruling holds that governments in the court's jurisdiction (which includes California) cannot enforce ordinances that ban public camping or criminalize sleeping outdoors on public property if there is no real option for sleeping indoors. Shelter is required to be offered before unsheltered people may be relocated from public lands; however, given the unprecedented need for transitional and long-term housing in Santa Clara County, there is currently only shelter capacity for approximately one quarter of the unsheltered population. For this reason, there is often little that Valley Water can do to relocate encampments until there are sufficient housing alternatives.

While Valley Water is not a law enforcement agency, nor do we provide direct homelessness/housing services, we are committed to using the power we have as an environmental stewardship agency to protect our waterways in collaboration with cities and the County as they fulfill their public safety and social service roles.
