Housing Options to the Unhoused Along Creeks - Response to BMR R-23-0007

Through BMR R-23-0007, Director Beall requested a lessons learned discussion on providing housing options to the unhoused along creeks in the context of Valley Water's agreement with the City of San José to relocate encampments in support of the Coyote Creek Flood Protection Projects.

#### **Staff Response**

The Agreement between the City of San José and the Santa Clara Valley Water District to Address Unhoused Encampments to Support the Coyote Creek Flood Protection Projects (Agreement) was executed in April 2023 and has a term of 18 months. City of San José will continue to provide housing options to unhoused residents along Coyote Creek throughout the entire term of the Agreement.

Valley Water will participate in a joint meeting with City of San José in October 2023 to discuss the Agreement and future agreements related to unhoused relocations. Discussion topics will include lessons learned, outcomes for the unhoused, and potential amendments to the Agreement.

Valley Water has prepared a Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the proposed Fisheries and Aquatic Habitat Collaborative Effort (FAHCE) Project (Proposed Project or Project) to fulfill the Valley Water's lead agency responsibilities under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The Final EIR is being submitted to the Board for their information in advance of a scheduled August 8, 2023, Board meeting during which the Board will consider the Final EIR for certification prior to approving the Project.

The Proposed Project implements a Fish Habitat Restoration Plan (FHRP) and includes restoration measures specified in a 2003 FAHCE Settlement Agreement intended to resolve a water rights complaint filed with the State Water Resources Control Board. The Proposed Project includes both flow measures (reservoir re-operations rule curves, referred to as the FAHCE flows) and non-flow measures such as fish barrier remediation, and measures to increase spawning and rearing habitat. Implementation of the FHRP includes up to four phases, with restoration measures to be adaptively managed through an Adaptive Management Program (AMP).

The EIR evaluates the environmental impacts of implementation of the Phase 1 measures; impacts of flow measures are evaluated at a detailed "project" level, whereas impacts of the non-flow measures are evaluated at a more general "programmatic" level details as the characteristics of these projects were unavailable when the EIR was prepared. Phase 1 also includes maintenance of existing facilities and monitoring. Phases 2 through 3 would be considered based on the results of monitoring during Phase 1. These subsequent phases, and measures that might be undertaken during these phases, are speculative at this time, and are therefore not evaluated in this EIR.

Pursuant to CEQA, Valley Water, as the lead agency for the Program, prepared a Draft EIR to evaluate environmental impacts of the Proposed Project. The Draft EIR was distributed for review and comment the to the State Clearinghouse, regulatory agencies, and interested members of the public. The official comment period lasted 115 days from June 30, 2021, to October 15, 2021.

The Final EIR identified significant environmental impacts from non-flow measures on terrestrial biological resources and paleontological resources but concluded that these impacts would be reduced to less-than-significant levels with mitigation measures. The Final EIR also identified significant impacts from non-flow measures on cultural resources, tribal cultural resources, and noise but concluded that these impacts would remain significant and unavoidable even with mitigation.

In addition to the Proposed Project, the Final EIR evaluates three alternatives: (1) No Project Alternative; (2) Non-flow Measures Alternative; and (3) the FAHCE-plus Alternative. Under the No Project Alternative, there would be no implementation of the Fish Habitat Restoration Plan and Valley Water would maintain its existing operations. Under the Non-flow Measures Only Alternative, the flow measures and related monitoring proposed as part of the FHRP would not be implemented, and only the non-flow measures and related maintenance and monitoring included in the Proposed Project would be implemented. Under the FAHCE-plus Alternative, the Proposed Project's flow measures would be combined with an additional set of rules designed to further improve fish

migration. The EIR evaluates the Proposed Project and FAHCE-plus Alternative, the environmentally superior alternative, at the same level of details. At the August 8, 2023, Board meeting, the Board will be asked to approve the Proposed Project or an alternative to the Proposed Project such as the FAHCE-plus Alternative.

The Final EIR contains responses to all comments received on the Draft EIR, as well as limited revisions to the Draft EIR text in response to public comments. Prior to Project approval, CEQA requires that the Board review and consider the information contained in the Final EIR, certify that the Final EIR was prepared in compliance with CEQA requirements, adopt a mitigation monitoring and reporting program (MMRP), make CEQA findings for each significant impact, and adopt a Statement of Overriding Considerations for the significant and unavoidable impacts.
