# Outlook as of August 1, 2023

Thanks to healthy winter storms, Santa Clara County's drought classification was changed in March from Abnormally Dry to "None." Valley Water received 100% allocations of water from the State Water Project (SWP) and the Central Valley Project (CVP) this year. On April 11, 2023, the Board of Directors replaced the mandatory call to reduce water use with a voluntary call for 15% water conservation compared to 2019. On June 13, 2023, the Board adopted a resolution to support water conservation as a way of life and an ordinance with a set of permanent water waste prohibitions for Santa Clara County.

# Weather

- Rainfall in San José:
  - » Month of July, City of San José = 0 inches
- San José average daily high temperature was 82 degrees Fahrenheit in July, which is higher than the five-year average for July (81.1 degrees Fahrenheit)

# Imported Water

- In July (through July 30), the SWP operated Banks pumping plant with an average daily export of 12,692 acre-feet, resulting in a total export of 380,757 acre-feet from the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta
- In July (through July 30), the CVP operated Jones pumping plant with an average daily export of 8,095 acre-feet, resulting in a total export of 242,857 acre-feet from the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta
- Releases are being made from San Luis Reservoir to supplement Delta Exports to meet southof-Delta demands

# Conserved Water

- Saved 80,078 acre-feet in FY22 through Valley Water's long-term conservation program (baseline year is 1992)
- Long-term program goal is to save nearly 100,000 acre-feet by 2030 and 110,000 acre-feet
- On June 13, 2023, the Board adopted a resolution to support water conservation as a way of life in Santa Clara County and an ordinance with a set of permanent water waste prohibitions

# Recycled Water

- Estimated July 2023 production = 2,104 acre-feet
- Estimated year-to-date through July = 8,317 acre-feet or 86% of the five-year average
- Silicon Valley Advanced Water Purification Center produced an estimated 1.6 billion gallons (4,803 acre-feet) of purified water in 2022. Since the beginning of 2023, about 2,032 acrefeet of purified water has been produced. The purified water is blended with existing tertiary recycled water for South Bay Water Recycling Program customers

Alternative Sources • As of December 10, 2019, Valley Water's wastewater contract right from Palo Alto/ Mountain View remains at 11,200 acre-feet/year

# ATTACHMENT TO CLAIM AGAINST THE SANTA CLARA VALLEY WATER DISTRICT

Describe how the incident or loss happened, and the reason you believe the Santa Clara Valley Water District is responsible for your damages.

In detail, describe the damage or injury.

This was all personally viewed by Rebecca Wolff of Valley Water Vegetation Field Operations.

During the occurrence of a severe wind and rain storm, willow trees on property owned by the Water District fell across Wildcat Creek destroying a section of my chain-link fence with chain-link double gate.

I also suffered losses of a more gradual nature from the multiple willow trees growing on the property owned by the Water District that had bent, deformed, and otherwise impacted my chainlink fencing.

My fence is necessary for protection of the crops on my property from destruction by wildlife (deer) as well as to protect my household pets and family from other roaming forms of wildlife (coyote and bobcats). The damage that the willow trees have caused to my fencing deprives me of both safety and protection.

The chain-link fence was initially constructed by Security Pacific Fencing, and I have attached a bid for repair to the fencing gate damaged by the fallen tree trunk as well as repairs to the portion of the fence line that has been damaged by the living willow trees growing on the Water District property so as to expose my property and family to the above-described risks. Additionally, attached are photographs of the downed tree and the damage it created. Also attached is a receipt for work done by Mario Gonsalez for the cost of cutting up the tree trunk and branches that have fallen onto my property from the Water District property as well as a statement for the cost of removing the trunks and limb that continue to overhang my property and pose a continuing threat of personal injury and property damage.

Dear Mr. Cahen:

The Valley Water District's certified letter dated 07/25/2023 was received and signed for at the Saratoga main post office 07/28/2023. Pursuant to California Government Code Sections 911.4-912.2, inclusive, and specifically pursuant to California Government Code Section 911.6(b)(1), application is hereby made for leave to present Damage Claim for damages that occurred during the California State of Emergency as declared by Governor Gavin Newsom on 03/08/2023.

The Claim is for losses and damages caused by the catastrophic storms that were so powerful that in addition to Governor Newsom's State of Emergency, the U.S. President declared a state of emergency, and the U.S. federal government extended the period of time for filing of tax returns as well as payment of taxes by 6 months (until October 2023). Claimant's damages were the cumulative results of the incessant winter storms that made it virtually impossible to make any assessment of damages or obtain any estimates for repairs, including the trimming/removal of fallen trees as well as removal/replacement of damaged fencing.

Claimant contacted Valley Water District with regard to the damage to Claimant's property, and ultimately Valley Water District Visitation Program Specialist Rebecca Wolff made a site visit on 06/29/2023. During the site visit, Ms. Wolff informed Claimant that a Claim Form for the cost of damages could be submitted and agreed to forward an email copy of the form that day. Although Ms. Wolff was reassigned to other areas to follow the storm damage that had occurred, it was approximately 2 weeks before Claimant received an email copy of the form from the Valley Water District.

Less than 2 weeks later, the Claim Form that is now being returned was submitted.

It is courtesily requested that the Valley Water District Board grant this Application as authorized under California Government Code Section 911.6(b)(1) on the basis that the State and Federal declared State of Emergency constituted either or both a surprise or excusable neglect and that Santa Clara County was not prejudiced in its defense of the Claim by the failure to present the Claim within the time specified in California Government Code Section 911.2.

### **Comment Form**

The details of the flow regime of FAHCE+ was not agreed to, and yet VW staff put this flow regime in as if it was agreed to. We don't think it is the best starting place for flows. The recommended regime submitted by Gary Stern of NMFS is what we'd recommend as it has better overall flows to support the fishery.

The suggested Adaptive Management plan is virtually non-existent, and does not have adequate detail to know what or how it will work. It also does not have numerical fishery targets as were discussed in the Cal Trout/NCCFFI comments to

the DEIR. This needs further work and discussion before the EIR becomes final.

Lastly, because FAHCE is the program focused on recovering the fishery and improving its watershed, the EIR needs to reflect better how that will happen and when certain goals are met. The program was on hold between 2005 and 2018 with no progress. At this point, the fishery is in much worse shape than even 2005, and it was not good then. The fish do not have the time that the FEIR shows for performance and actions, and will go extinct long before the dates shown in the plan. The FEIR should not be approved as written as it does not meet the needs of the fishery.




