- Valley Water Board approved \$2 million for the Low-Income Residential Water Rate Assistance Program to help families pay water bills. Valley Water partnered with Sacred Heart Community Service to implement the program and continue providing this critical service to low-income households in Santa Clara County. (flyer in 4 languages English, Spanish, Chinese, and Vietnamese was given the commissioners to help spread the word)
- Safe Clean Water and Natural Flood Protection Grants/Partnerships Program is year-round, 2 grant opportunities:
 - ✓ County \$5,000 per grant towards the purchase, installation, and maintenance of a water refill station of your choice County \$5,000 per grant towards the purchase, installation, and maintenance of a water refill station of your choice.
 - ✓ Mini grants program small \$5,000 grants that are related to water conservation, environmental stewardship and flood protection located within Santa Clara County. Grants information is at our website:
