Hurricane Florence Response

- Initial EMS System planning scenario
- Initial steps for EMS System
 - Difficult decisions (mandating/holding employees, changes to response during storm); info/briefing; safety messaging; conference calls with system stakeholders; all hands on deck!
- Roles at EOC, DOC, RWECC, Shelters
- Deployments NCTF8 and AST
 - 2 USAR medics with 2 Swift Water Rescue Teams
 - 3 USAR medics Type 3 Structural Collapse Team
 - 2 EVAC1 missions
 - Onslow Memorial Hospital evacuation to Duke Regional, Duke Raleigh, and WakeMed.
 - St Pauls High School (Robeson County) to Richmond Pines NH in Hamlet, NC.





NC CRES PLAN

- 700 page document that outlines in detail the States plan for evacuation and sheltering for the coastal counties
- Developed in 2007

Shelter Ops

"The People Storm"

- Three Raleigh shelters receive multiple unannounced school buses of evacuees from Eastern NC
- Many with healthcare needs (primarily oxygen dependent)
- Limited mobility patients
- Requests from shelters for equipment, supplies, etc.
- Known and unknown issues
- Staffing challenges

Friday the 14th to Monday the 17th

Shelter support becomes the primary mission

- A change in organizational structure.
- Had a Comms plan on MC_Alpha for all Shelters
- All variety of supplies, medications, oxygen supported by Logistics

Implementation of RelyMD

- EMS delivered IS iPads to each shelter with MiFi devices
- Used extensively to avoid many transports

By Monday:


- Transferred all residents from CRES shelters to UNC Friday Center or State Medical Services Shelter (SMSS).
- All hurricane operations demobilized and normal operations resumed.

Hurricane Michael

- Smooth operation and much easier response
 - Little wind, some rain...everyone still in the mode from Florence.
 - Biggest issue was the loss of 911 phone lines

Glenwood Towers Fire

- 14 story, 301 apartment senior subsidized housing in the middle of Glenwood South.
- Fire alarm dispatched with RFD arriving to find heavy fire from a 9th story apartment window.



Glenwood Towers Fire




- High rise operations went as trained with excellent cooperation between RFD, EMS, and RPD.
- 24 ambulances on location amongst many other DCs and Command Staff to build out ICS org chart. Even more helping in the County.
- Excellent communication with our area hospitals.
 - Only 6 transports, but close to 200 people evacuated many with chronic complaints "unwell vs. unwell from the fire".
 - Communications with EDs can be IMPROVED!

Mass Casualty Comms Plan Update



- The portable radios at all of the Wake County ED's have been updated so that the home button will automatically carry the user to the MC_Hotel channel.
- This should improve the ease of access to the predetermined communications channel when the "ring down" for a major incident occurs in Wake County.
- Exercising and Testing process on December 13th with a go-live shortly after.





Year thru October


- 89,206 incidents

- 5 year increase of nearly 10,000 calls by November 1st


EMS Response Data 2014-2018










ESTAT PER MONTH LAST 12 MONTHS




Hospital Diversion
