Regional Organizations Updates

1-Cape Fear River Assembly

Recent Activities CFRA continues its strategic planning effort. The final Strategic Plan is expected to be adopted in early 2021, to focus the organization's mission, vision and the strategies to be implemented to foster partnerships and knowledge-sharing among the various diverse groups of the Cape Fear River basin.

2-Jordan Lake One Water (JLOW)

Recent Activities

- information about JLOW's activities can be accessed at <u>TJCOG's JLOW web page</u>.
- JLOW is providing significant input into the 2021-22 NC Division of Water Resources (NCDWR) Jordan Lake rules re-adoption effort following the NC Policy Collaboratory's Jordan Lake Nutrient Management Study report. JLOW is working to establish a formal organization to share knowledge and resources to improve the basin. JLOW will continue to work closely with the state once rules readoption begins and plans to submit a recommendation that JLOW serve as an alternative mechanism for compliance with the new rules.

- Five workgroups (Integrated Water Management (IWM) Implementation, Organization, Monitoring, Evaluation and Finance) met regularly through 2020, and completed their assignments last fall. Follow-up meetings may be needed to finalize details of JLOW's input to the rules re-adoption process.
- JLOW plans multiple large-group stakeholder meetings in 2021, after the workgroup recommendations have been consolidated.

3-Drought Management Advisory Council

Recent Activities

Council reviews drought designations on a weekly basis (issued on website each Thursday morning). The latest North Carolina drought index map as of April 6th is below. No drought or abnormally dry conditions currently exist in the state. Assess NC DMAC's weekly <u>Current Drought Assessment Report (ncdrought.org)</u> here.



- Wake County has been experiencing dry conditions since early March, and rainfall is about 2.5 inches below normal for the past 30 days, though due to high precipitation totals in the winter, the total rainfall year-to-date is normal and past 12 months is above normal.
- The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)'s seasonal weather outlook projects above-normal temperatures and above-normal precipitation for the state through summer 2021.

4-North Carolina League of Municipalities, Regulatory Action Committee (RAC)

Recent Activities The latest <u>League Bulletin (nclm.org)</u> was posted March 5th. The bulletin includes discussion of the General Assembly's passage of a COVID relief bill.

5- North Carolina Policy Collaboratory

Recent Activities

- The Collaboratory has initiated a Falls Lake Nutrient Management Study to be completed by 2023, including coordination with the Upper Neuse Basin Association. The Collaboratory recently published a Falls Lake Nutrient Management Study project brief describing the project. An interim update on the study is expected to be submitted to the Legislature later in December.
- The Collaboratory will host a virtual forum on May 4th to discuss their research on PFAS and GenX in North Carolina. Register at the forum's webpage: <u>PFAS Testing</u> Network Virtual Forum - North Carolina Policy Collaboratory (unc.edu)
- Jordan Lake Nutrient Management Study submitted to the General Assembly in December 2019 can be accessed here: <u>Jordan Lake Study Final Report</u>.

6-Triangle Area Water Supply Monitoring Project

Recent Activities

- Links to partner communities' monitoring of perfluorinated chemicals (PFCs) and other contaminants of emerging concern are on the organization homepage, tawsmp.org. Links to real-time USGS streamflow data for the Triangle region can also be accessed from the homepage.
- Currently in Project Phase 8 (July 2017-June 2022), with bi-monthly sampling at 10 reservoir sites and 4 stream sites, stream gage measurements at 10 gaging stations & annual storm-event sampling at other stream sites. Phase 8 includes analysis for 1,4-dioxane, bromide and chromium as a special project.
- The next TAWSMP Steering Committee regular quarterly meeting will be held virtually in May 2021.

7-Triangle J Council of Governments (TJCOG)

Recent Activities

- Clean Water Education Partnership (CWEP, https://nc-cleanwater.com/) assisted its local government partners with Regional Creek Week, which was held March 13-20; Partner local governments contributed virtual resources and events.
- TJCOG hosts a quarterly joint meeting of its Smart Growth and Water Resources
 Collaboratives at TJCOG. These meetings often include agenda topics of interest
 to Partnership members. The next Collaborative meeting will be held (virtually) on
 June 10th, topic TBD.
- TJCOG and the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) are working with local and county governments on the 2050 regional transportation plan, which includes forecasts of future regional growth.

8-Triangle Water Supply Partnership

Recent Activities

- Raleigh, Cary, Apex and Morrisville are represented in the Partnership, along with communities in Chatham, Durham, Harnett, Johnston and Orange counties.
- Partnership meetings occur every other month, including recently on December 4th. The next meeting will be held (virtually) on June 4th. Meetings are announced at <u>trianglewaterpartnership.org</u>; signup for email meeting notices is available. Meetings are open to the public.
- Current Partnership initiatives are an updated regional water system interconnect computer model, modeling regional water shortage responses using the state's OASIS model, and a regionally-consistent water shortage response plan. Partners are also communicating to maintain a regionally-consistent approach toward statemandated source water risk & resilience plans and emergency response plans. The Partnership plans to begin a regional water supply plan for utilities in 2022.
- A subgroup of four Partnership members Chatham County, Durham, Orange Water and Sewer Authority, and Pittsboro are moving forward with plans to construct a new jointly-owned water supply intake and water treatment plant on the western shore of Jordan Lake, to serve their long-term needs. They anticipate the new facilities will be operating by 2031. Currently the only Jordan Lake intake is operated by Cary and Apex. Partnership member Jeff Adkins is program manager for this effort.

9-Upper Neuse River Basin Association

Recent Activities

- The UNRBA Board of Directors last met on March 17th, and the Path Forward Committee on April 6th. Both meetings were held virtually. The Board is chaired by Wake Co. Commissioner Sig Hutchinson. Topics discussed at the Board meeting included:
 - DWR is drafting its 5-year status report on Falls Lake, to be published this spring. UNRBA is being provided an opportunity to review the draft report.
 - UNRBA submittal of comments on the USEPA draft Ambient Water Quality
 Criteria Recommendations for Lakes and Reservoirs.
 - Coordination with NC Policy Collaboratory researchers on the Falls Lake Nutrient Management study, including site selection for the onsite wastewater treatment system study.

11-Triangle Area Watershed Protection Program (formerly Upper Neuse Clean Water Initiative)

Recent Activities

- The Review Board for the Watershed Protection Program reviews funding applications for two separate watershed protection programs: 1) Raleigh Watershed Protection Program and 2) City of Durham Water Supply Watershed Protection Program.
 - The next Review Board meeting will take place April 16, 2021. Coordination Subcommittee member Nancy Daly is on the Watershed Protection Board.
