What are Grab and Go Activity Bags?

They are individual bags filled with a single activity that children can put together in their home. The activities allow children to explore their creative side and learn educational fact. For example, June was National Safety Month so we created sailboats and facts about water safety.

Benefits

You can engage a kid for quite a while with paper and crayons, but it's always fun to have a variety of items to keep them occupied. Grab and go activity bags are filled with inexpensive items with an educational or life lesson they learn from it. Grab and go activity bags are also a great idea for community groups for volunteer events. Since the activity bags are easy to make, you can assemble a variety throughout the week or month to give to those at the community event.

Supplies for Grab and Go Bags

You can find the supplies you need for the Grab and Go Bags on websites like Amazon, Walmart, etc or from your local businesses (see slides 7-8 for more details). The main thing to consider when planning grab and go bags is the price of each material that you need. If you do not want to shop online, a lot of the items used in activity bags are inexpensive and can easily be bought from the dollar store if that is what you choose to do.

Example: If you are making Spoon Ants for the kids to make at home, you will need 2 plastic spoons, 3 pipe cleaners, 1 set of googly eyes, and the instruction sheet.. If you are feeling extra, you can add markers to decorate the plain spoons. Most of the ideas for the activity kits come from Pinterest, 4H, and other youth programs. Not every activity kit assembly is identical, but

Soliciting Donation

If you do not want to buy everything online, another option is donations from local community partners like the grocery store down the street or a small owned business. One of the community partners that we had this past summer was the Target right around the corner from one of our sites. The manager donated a \$100 gift card that we used to buy more school supplies for our Back to School kit distributions.

To successfully get donations, you need to draft a letter to give to the business with your contact information, the organization your represent, background of the event, and the materials you are asking for. On the next slide, you will find a sample letter that we use for donations.

Sample Grab and Go Bag Activity

Spoon Bugs



Materials

- · 2 Plastic spoons, attached
- Pipe cleaners (3 per bug)
- Googly Eyes

Instructions

- 1. Make sure the spoon backs are facing up.
- 2. Wrap the three pipe cleaners around the spoon body.
- 3. Make sure to leave some of the pipe cleaners at the end to bend into legs.
- 4. To finish the bug, put on googly eyes with glue dots.

Distributing Grab and Go Bags

Distribution depends on the event that you are hosting. Weather is not always on our side, so pay attention the days leading up to the event if it is outside. Always have a back up plan to prevent being stuck in bad weather.

- If it is in a meeting space, I would recommend tables spread out with information about any upcoming events and the grab and go activity bags. This reduces crowding in the area and helps move everyone else along.
- If it is curbside, I would recommend having a table for the grab and go bags to go on, a tent if it is sunny out, waters and snacks for volunteers, and information about any upcoming events you plan to host.
- If you are dropping them off in a neighborhood or community yourself, make sure to have a team of people for safety reasons. The team can be a minimum on 2, but 4 is a solid number so you can split up in pairs. Bring water and snacks to prevent injury and dress like you are going for a hike. After a while, walking door to door can feel tiring.
