

Historic Oak View County Park Photography Rules

1. Photographer and clients/subjects will stay out of all restricted areas (including animal pens, interior of any buildings, trees). Please do not block, obstruct, or close any building entrances or doors.
2. Photographer and clients will conduct themselves in a proper and professional manner.
 - Lewd or lascivious behavior including language or photographs is prohibited.
 - Park staff has the authority to expel photographers and/or their clients from the park if the actions of the photographers and/or clients are deemed improper by park staff.
3. Photographer and clients will not impede normal park operations and programming. Programming occurs most weekdays between 10 a.m. and noon.
 - The party is not allowed to disrupt park visitors or staff.
 - No associated equipment for a photo shoot is permitted in any indoor buildings or allowed to block visitor entrances or pathways.
4. No special consideration shall be given (golf carts, security, use of park equipment, etc.)
 - No power or electrical power will be provided by Wake County Parks for the purposes of film, video, or photography projects.
5. Photographer and clients will only use the park during regular park hours.
6. Photographer and clients will not disturb any natural or man-made park features, for example:
 - Any props used must be removable, stay with the photographer at all times, and cannot be left unattended to "reserve" spots.
 - No confetti, glitter, rice, and/or bird seed, and be careful using balloons as they are hazardous to wildlife if left behind and these have at times ended up caught up in our trees. Consumables such as cakes being used in photo shoots must be set on a blanket or other type of sheet and must be completely cleaned up when the shoot is finished.
 - Vegetation and wildlife will not be disturbed or removed. This includes the food for our goats or straw bales in the barn.
 - Signage will not be used.
7. Photographer is responsible for familiarizing themselves and informing their clients of all park rules and regulations.
8. Wake County reserves the right to prohibit any projects which are not in the best interest of the County.
