#### **Project Overview**

- Wake County awarded an FTA Integrated Mobility Innovation (IMI) grant
- Improve access to jobs, school, healthcare, and other services for northeast county residents
- Objective is to launch microtransit services that provide first 5-mile, last 5-mile for rural residents

#### Why Northeast Wake County?




The demographics of residents in the SmartRide NE microtransit zone are as follows:

- Total 2020 Census Population: 50,000+
   Unincorporated Population: 24,000+
- Minority population: 23,000+ (45%)
- Senior population estimate: 7,400 (65+)
- Youth estimate: 12,000+ (under 18)
- Low-income population: 3,800+
- Single or no vehicle households: 430+ (no vehicle), 5,400+ (1 vehicle)

#### **Microtransit**

- On-demand and real-time book when you're ready
- Dynamic routing and scheduling route will vary
- Operates within a "geofenced zone" shorter trips
- Leverages your smartphone and new tech



#### **Microtransit Goals**

- Quicker and easier trip scheduling
- More convenient and shorter trips
- Connections to regional commuter routes
- Real time arrival updates
- Expand ridership beyond the current 148 riders








