



Located just 5 miles south of downtown Raleigh, Historic Yates Mill was established before the City in the mid-1700s and is now the last operating water-powered mill, out of 70 or more gristmills that once existed in the Wake County area. The mill ground corn into meal and wheat into flour for the local community for over 200 years. Today it serves as a one-of-a-kind historic site and a center of education for all ages.

### Park Features

The mill is the centerpiece of a 174-acre park which is managed as a native wildlife refuge (pets are not allowed). Park amenities include over 3 miles of hiking trails, picnic areas, boardwalk fishing, viewing scopes, and wayside exhibits, among other features.

### Park Hours

The park is open seven days a week from 8 a.m. until sunset. Please call 919-856-6675 for the exact closing time for the date(s) of your visit. The A.E. Finley Center for Education and Research (i.e., the park center) is open 7 days a week from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. The gristmill is available for scheduled group tours, March through November.

### Parking

Parking for cars is located outside the Finley Center; we also have three school bus parking spaces available. Students may be dropped off in front of the Finley Center at the bus loop.

### Mill Accessibility

The mill is a historic site and may not be accessible for everyone. There are a few stairs that must be climbed to enter the mill. If you have physical ability questions, please ask the Group Program Coordinator.

### Pre- and Post-Visit Materials

### Lunch

You may bring lunch to eat at the park. You will need to relay to the field trip coordinator that you will need scheduled time for a snack or lunch break. Please note that refrigeration is not available. While the park does have water fountains, it does not have ice, other drinks, or snack machines.

### Cancelations/Weather

All cancelations of organized group programs require a two-week notice, but please inform park staff as soon as possible if your group will be unable to make it out for any reason. If weather is deemed unsafe or if the day is determined to be a washout, park staff may cancel your program.

### Organized Group Programs

Please call the Group Program Coordinator at (919) 856-5638 to schedule a field trip. Reservations are taken year-round by phone or email on a first-come, first-serve basis at least one month in advance. Choose from a variety of mill tour types, classroom discovery labs, environmental field experiences, and additional self-guided activities to complete your park visit and meet your curricular goals.

- Group Programs are held Monday through Thursday.
- Our main fieldtrip seasons are March-May and September-November, but we will have some limited field trip availability in the Winter and Summer.
- We do not do mill tours during the winter (December-February)
- Group sizes are restricted to 90 students per day plus chaperones. Large groups are broken up into groups of up to 30 students. Mill tours are restricted by total individuals attending with a maximum of 30 people total (including students and adults), for a maximum of 90 people total.
- Please let us know if there are certain guidelines or special needs your group requires so that we can try to accommodate

<b>Nature Journaling</b>	Test out your nature observation skills by observing wildlife around the pond while using your provided nature journal with prompts.	<b>Suggested length:</b> 30-45 minutes
<b>Activity Packet</b>	Enjoy some of our fun activity packets that include activities surrounding historical, agricultural, and environmental topics and themes.	<b>Suggested length:</b> 30-45 minutes
