When we get there, I can start my visit by walking on one of the trails or going to the visitor center. There are many doors we can use to enter the visitor center.



There are pamphlets with maps and information that I can pick up at kiosks or in the visitor center.



I can ask park staff for help or directions.



The visitor center has an exhibit I can explore, a front desk where I can learn more, and a kid's corner where I can play.



The visitor center also has bathrooms and a water fountain.



Some of the things in the museum exhibit move and make noise.



If it is too noisy or I want something to do with my hands, I can ask the person at the front desk to borrow a My Yates Mill Park Pack, which has headphones and fidget toys.



If I stop by the fish tank in the visitor center, I will not tap on the glass and bother the fish.



I can go walking on the trails. There are two boardwalks we might use to walk over water. I will stay on the marked trail while walking.



If I go walking on the trails, I will probably see some wildlife. I can look at the animals but will respect their space as wild creatures.



If I get tired while walking, I can sit down on a bench.





I can go see the mill if I want. The mill might be open for me to go inside and look around, and it might not.

If I go see the mill, the sound of cars on the road next to us might be loud. The sound of water flowing might be loud too. If I want to muffle the sound, I can hold my hands over my ears, ask to go to a quieter place, or use headphones.



When we are ready to leave, I will go back to the parking lot and my vehicle. If I borrowed a My Yates Mill Park Pack, I will return it at the visitor center front desk first.



Historic Yates Mill is a big park! I might not get to see or do everything I want to do in just one day, but I will enjoy the time I have, and I can come back another day.
