Analog to Art



1. Drop Off or Mail In - Bring or send your film to the lab, where each roll is carefully managed by our film experts.



2. Film Development - Processed in a true, professional photo lab with traditional chemistry & equipment: C-41 (color negative), E-6 (slide film) & B&W (black & white)



3. High-Resolution Scanning - Negatives are scanned, color-corrected, and cleaned. Files are delivered as JPEGs for print or digital use.




4. Digital Delivery - Receive your scans via email, cloud link, or USB. Share your favorite shots on social media! **TIP:** Back up your files to a secondary location!



5. Archival Printing - Order prints on real photo paper, canvas, or metal—archival quality that lasts 80+ years.

What is ISO?

ISO (film speed) determines how sensitive the film is to light.

How should I store film rolls?

Store unprocessed film in a cool, dry place—ideally in the fridge to slow down aging. Keep it in its canister or a sealed bag to protect from moisture, heat, and light. After shooting, label each roll and develop it as soon as possible for best results.

Load film carefully!

Load and unload film in low light or shade to avoid light leaks.

Make It Real: Print Your Shots


Making prints from film photographs is like bringing your images to life—you get to hold your memories in your hands, not just see them on a screen. It's exciting to see how your shots translate from negative to a tangible piece of art you can frame, share, or gift.



- ✓ Start with your best shots or print the whole roll. It's your film, your call.
- ✓ Go classic with 4x6 prints—they're budget-friendly and keep your full frame intact. Want a retro vibe? Add a border.
- ✓ Feeling bold? Go big—up to 40x60"! Film has the detail to look amazing, even at giant sizes.
- Choose paper or surface: photographic, canvas or metal.

Embrace the mistakes!

With film, you don't get instant feedback—no previews, no redos. That means surprises are part of the process: accidental double exposures, blank rolls, light leaks, or wild color shifts. But that's also the fun of it. The imperfections tell a story, and each "mistake" is a chance to learn, experiment, and create something totally unexpected.
